<u>Club Manager's Message:</u> I want to share a few random thoughts with you. First of all, in the last newsletter I mentioned that I was considering a monthly Tuesday evening Swiss. I was hoping for some positive feedback, but that didn't happen. It's still on the table if there is interest.



If you are trying to earn points, the summer months are full of special games. There are 10 NAP qualifiers, a week of SILVER points, the World Wide pairs and the usual assortment of charity games, club championships and Unit Wide Games. The complete schedule is at the end of the newsletter.

When I'm directing and wandering around the room, I often see an irregularity occur where the offended side chooses to just 'let it go' or accepts a ruling from an opponent who may or may not actually know the law. At The Table: Pard opened 1C and opponents passed throughout. After your 1H, pardner jumped to 3D. This is a splinter bid. If he had both minors and a big hand, he would have reversed by simply bidding 2D. Of course, if he just had a normal two-minor hand, he would have opened 1D and then bid 2C. Anyway, the splinter bid showed that he had hearts and a singleton or void in diamonds. What would you do now?

I was South. When Pard responded with 1H, my hand became very good. Some people would use 4D as the splinter for hearts. I did not like the idea because 3D conveyed the same message. Also, you were not sure there would be a game. Give Pard AK of diamonds and 4 little hearts and he would have responded with 1H, too.

My good partner reevaluated his hand after my 3D splinter. There was no wasted value in diamonds. He did the right thing by cue-bidding 4C. That was all I needed to use 4NT to ask about keycards and the Q of trumps. Things learned from this hand:

- 1. Bridge is a partnership game.
- 2. Reevaluation of a hand during bidding progress is important.
- 3. Do not follow points system to the tee. 25 or 26 "points" is enough for a small slam when there is no wasted value in one suit with a singleton, better still a void.

Some conventions are very useful. Without the splinter, it would be difficult to reach this perfect slam. Lucky or not. (This is a real hand played on Tuesday, May 29, 2007. Directions are rotated.)
